CIVIL AVIATION

**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Harrogate)
Regulations 2019**

Made - - - - 31st July 2019

Coming into force - - 21st September 2019

The Secretary of State has decided that it is necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of Harrogate, Yorkshire, by reason of the intended gathering of a large number of persons there for the UCI World Road Cycle Championships.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Harrogate) Regulations 2019 and come into force on 21st September 2019.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(2) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(b).

Restricted airspace

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (3), and during the periods specified in paragraph (2), no aircraft is to fly below 3,500 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 2 nautical miles whose centre is at 535925N 0013135W.

(2) The periods referred to in paragraph (1) are—

- (a) between 0700 hours and 2200 hours on 21st September 2019,
- (b) between 0700 hours and 1900 hours on each of the 5 days starting on 22nd and ending on 26th September 2019, and
- (c) between 0700 hours and 2200 hours on each of the 3 days starting on 27th and ending on 29th September 2019.

(3) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft—

- (a) operated by or on behalf of—
 - (i) the National Police Air Service,
 - (ii) the North Yorkshire Police,



Outcomes of conciliation cases 2018-19




Non-cyber personal data breach reports received, Q4 2018-19

MLP Key Developments

Employment claims

- Fees introduced 2-13 and ACAS 2014
- 71% drop in tribunal claims between 2013 – 2016
- Still costing industry millions of pounds – 50% of MLP claims
- Claims rose significantly in 2017 – 2018
- Excess (if applicable)
 - rradar excess waiver
 - Excess applied at end of claim and only if lost or settled
