

At our annual Dinner, Peter Moran was presented with the CII Lifetime Achievement Award. This was a richly deserved award for a very popular IIL Council member who has served 4 different institutes over the last 55 years. Here Peter reflects on his time as a CII member.



It came as a complete surprise to me when I was awarded a Lifetime Achievement Award at the recent Insurance Institute of Leeds Annual Dinner. I feel honoured and proud to be recognised by my peers for my involvement in Institute affairs and this got me thinking back over my time as a CII member.

It all started for me in 1965 when I joined the local Institute in Newcastle Upon Tyne. Like most starting a career in insurance the only reason I had for joining the CII was to reduce the cost of my examination entries!

Soon however I was persuaded to become a member of Council and was appointed head of the young members section organising social and sports events for young members. This I did for 5 years until a promotion took me to Bournemouth.

Having transferred my CII membership. I was asked to join their local institute which helped me to settle into my new location. After 3 years I became President elect but a further promotion to my company's head office in Guildford meant I was unable to fulfil the office of President. This was the closest I ever came to hold this office as pressure of work made me decide to politely decline a number of offers from the various other Institute Councils I served on.

Subsequently, as work took me to other parts of the UK,

I have served as a Council member of the Institutes of Guildford (twice), Croydon and Leeds. My time with Leeds is by far the longest and 2020 will be my twentieth year on the IIL Council and fifty-fifth year as a CII member having worked for 4 different institutes.

I can honestly say that I have enjoyed every minute of the 55 years I have served on Councils across the country. During my time I have met many interesting and dedicated insurance professionals, many of whom I consider to be close friends. Over the years I have been given wise counsel by many and it pleases me immensely that I can pass on what I have learned to others.
