ML Offences



- Concealing, disguising, converting, transferring or removing criminal property from the Island.
- □ Entering or becoming concerned in an arrangement which facilitates the acquisition, retention, control or use of criminal property by or on behalf of another.
- Acquiring, using or possessing criminal property.
- □Now includes laundering your own property.

Fail To Disclose



- ☐ as soon as is practicable after the information or other matter mentioned....comes to that person.
- Defence-
- that person has a reasonable excuse for not making the required disclosure.
- ☐ Organisational damage limitation unlikely to be a reasonable excuse!



Tipping Off



Tipping off offence (regulated sector) the same but; Allows disclosures within the same undertaking, or within the same group Between institutions, legal advisors or relevant professional advisor if; ☐ The subject is a client or former client of them both; ☐ It involves a transaction involving them both; ☐ It involves a provision of service affecting them both; ☐ And it is for the purpose of only preventing an offence under this part (ML offences); And the institution is in a country or territory prescribed by order and have equivalent duties of professional confidentiality and data protection principles. Only covers disclosures between same groups i.e. credit to credit or legal to legal etc. Also tipping off if aware that a money laundering investigation is being, or may be carried out - discloses that an investigation is under way or being contemplated, the disclosure was likely to prejudice that investigation, information came to them in course of business.



Consent



□ Protected Disclosures – s153 POCA 2008

- Trade, business, profession or employment
- Know or suspect, or reasonable grounds
- Made to FCU or nominated officer

□ <u>Authorised</u> Disclosures – s154 POCA 2008

- Disclosure that property is criminal property
- Made before doing prohibited act
- Made whilst doing the prohibited act
- Made after the prohibited act
