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Personal finance inclusion in Sussex

The renaming of the Insurance Institute of Sussex, formerly the Insurance Institute of Brighton, has given the council an opportunity to become more inclusive.

This year, the team saw many of the graduates from its 2020 regeneration initiative take seats on the council, resulting in a younger and more diverse group.

Personal Finance Society members are well represented and funding was approved to provide seminars that reach out to meet their needs. These have included talks on the new pensions landscape, effective sales techniques, networking and presentation skills.

At the centre of these initiatives has been the introduction of a community group, which ensures the Institute connects with all members. One of the most successful events was inviting retired colleagues to afternoon tea in Sussex. Many of the attendees had worked in life and pensions and conversations were varied, with anecdotes and a strong interest in the next generation of advisers and insurers.

Pieces of Eight - Ahoy me hearties!



Not the usual greeting from one of your council members, but I thought you would enjoy the photo of me ready for Pirates' Day at the Maritime Museum with my 4 year old grandson.

However I am after your money and support.

I am the Insurance Charities Representative for the Insurance Institute of Sussex and during the week of 20 - 24 June we will be running an awareness campaign in workplaces. There will be display boxes

containing chocolates, pens and other branded items. Please help yourself to use and enjoy, in return for a generous donation.



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Every year I am approached by people who have worked in our industry, but who have fallen on hard times. I make initial enquiries about their situation and then arrange a visit to their home. Here I conduct an in depth interview and review their financial, physical and emotional situation carefully. I can find myself dealing with both young and old people, former senior managers and call handlers. After taking copies of relevant documents, I prepare a detailed report to submit to the Insurance Charities Board in London.

Then after help is approved, I will revisit the applicant to ensure there is an improvement in their situation or further aid is required. After that I conduct an annual assessment visit to gauge necessary changes in aid levels.

Sometimes I feel that expert advice is needed by the applicant and the Charities have access to many diverse experts. So the help that the Charities give to people is not solely financial, but they need money to be able to fund their work.

Obviously my work is confidential, but it can be so rewarding. Helping an elderly, infirm lady with her finances and then discovering on a tour of her flat that her bedroom carpet was so worn, as to be dangerous. Her delight when I recommended and had approved a new carpet was wonderful and we had tea and cakes to celebrate!

Particularly satisfying are situations involving children and the difference the Charities can make to their lives, from providing beds and furniture for small children when fathers struggle to care for them alone following bereavement; to giving Scout uniforms and money for annual camp to single parent families. I have organised retraining courses for redundancy victims and housed dogs in kennels for a homeless person.

Each approach I receive is carefully evaluated. I have been DBS checked and carry an ID card for the applicant's reassurance. Sometimes I judge that I may vulnerable in a situation and then I take my husband with me. I try to visit where the person is living to see for myself what the situation is and I have to be given totally free access for an application to process. If the applicant is homeless, then we have to meet in a cafe - wearing a red carnation, of course!

Most beneficiaries, regardless of continuing help, receive a Christmas hamper from the Charities and regular checks on their ongoing situations.
