


Training

- The Integrated Route
- The flying schools are business
- Two years plus to completion
- > Fit to Fly
- > 195 hours flight training (actual and simulator)



Costs £60,000 to £80,000 for basic licence Additional costs if extra training needed





Ready to Work

> Two years later & 80K plus debt

Join the expanding pilot pool with under 200 hours

Interview and Assessment including numerical and technical test. Some charge.

> 30 Minutes

No calculators

> 10 questions removed

Working

- When pilots start to earn is getting later and paying off loans taking longer
- Type rating: Airlines may require payment (approx. 30K)
- We are seeing bankruptcies / depression
- Agency pilots / Self employed
- Lifestyle is erratic
- > Annual medicals; Sim checks



Existing Pilots

- > 95% of our members are proud to be pilots
- But only 58% would recommend it as career, and in one recent poll in one company it was 27%
- Airlines looking to push more risk onto the pilot. Training costs; self employment; season only working

BALPA's ROLE



- Highlight to those thinking of entering the profession the associated costs and risks, driving home the stark reality of the "dream job".
- Established Career Services to give feedback to trainees and help them find a job.
- > The supply side; aiding experienced pilots to find jobs elsewhere creates some 'churn' in the pilot labour market.
- Challenging employers in their employment practices with a focus on profiling how BALPA has successfully negotiated contracts that offer employers flexibility but not at the expense of piling all the risk onto the shoulders of the pilot.
- Using all legal means to challenge agencies and employers who seek to dodge their responsibilities whether it be in the field of employment rights or tax and national insurance responsibilities.
- > Working with the TUC, etc to expose such practices and press for laws that protect.
