In this IIL lecture Norman Shanks talked about the evolution, current and future development of global aviation security systems designed to meet the needs of a global industry service. Norman explained that historically aviation security measures have typically been developed in response to past terrorists actions, particular those impacting western interests. In the presentation, Norman recognised the ever changing demands of the aviation regulators responding to terrorist events, and how these can and should be focused on improving safety for all users without creating a fortress mentality which creates unnecessary and unwelcome constraints on the industry.

• An understanding of how the International and specific EU common rules in aviation security have evolved • The key role that the aviation industry has in protecting its own future business interests from over regulation • How the industry can move from a reactive, government driven, to a proactive, industry led, approach for future aviation security measures.
