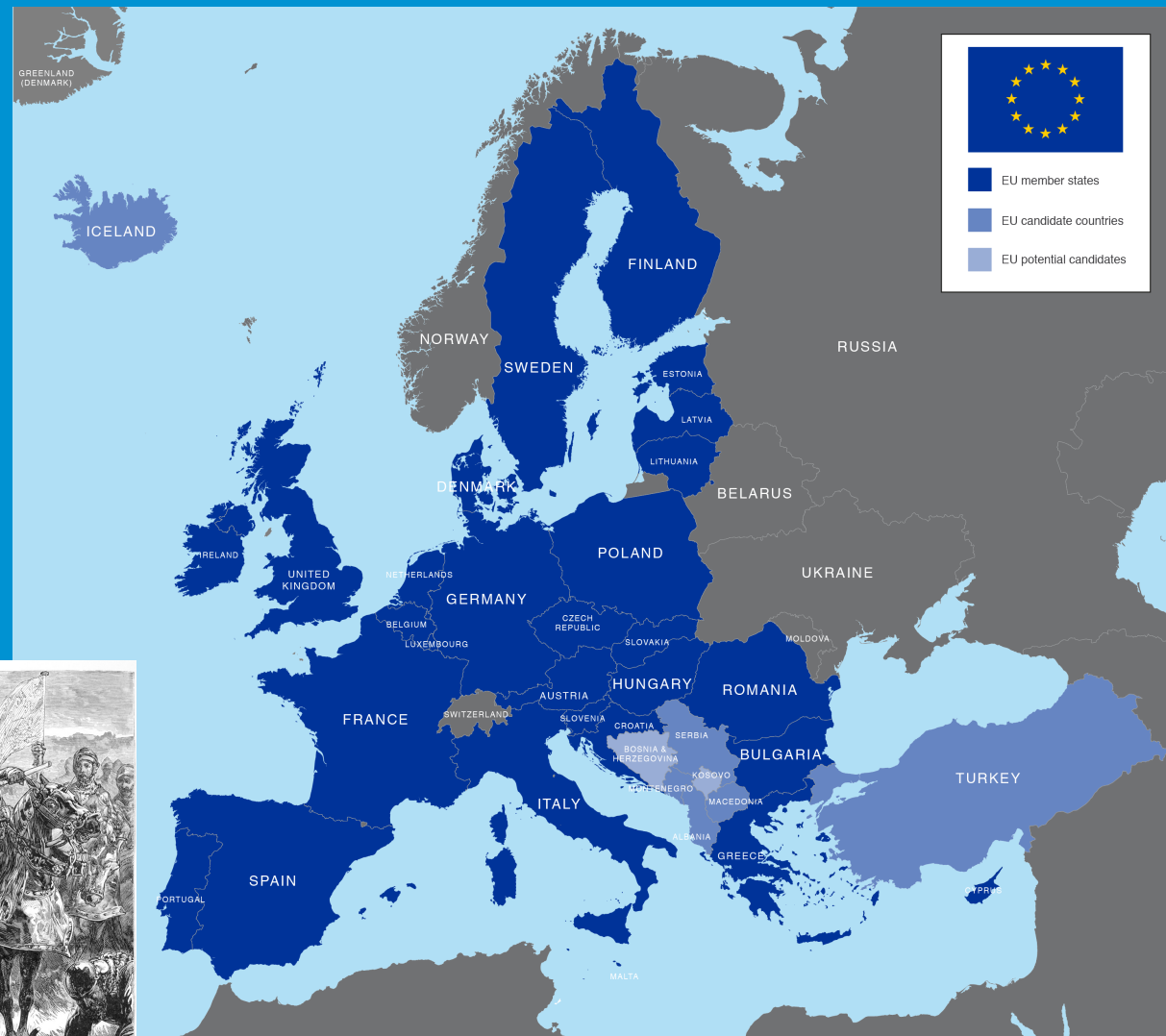
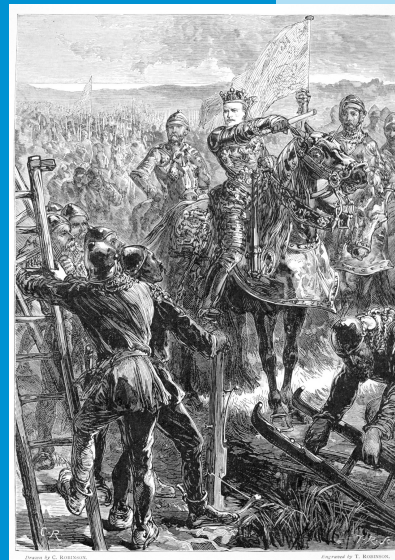

Data Protection: What do we have

- Article 8 ECHR - Privacy
- Article 8(1) Treaty Rights – protection of personal Data
- Data Protection
 - Data Protection Act 2002
 - Adequacy Decision
- Offences
 - Various
 - NOT for failing to comply with the 8 Data Protection Principles



Data Protection: What next

General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR)

- In force - 24 May 2016
- Compliance - 25 May 2018
- What about Brexit?



GDPR: The changes

- Six Principles
- Nine Rights
- Transparency
- Consent
- Children
- Special Category Data
- Extra-territoriality
- Fines - €20,000,000 (or 4%)



Data Protection: GDPR

What do you need to do

- GDPR is to put individuals *“in control of their own personal data”*
- This is all about compliance
 - Data Audit - 5 ‘W’s
 - Data Risk Assessment
 - Name & contact details of Data Protection Officer
 - Policies & procedures
 - Security arrangements – inc. safeguards if data transferred to third countries
 - Record Keeping – 6 Principles (consent, collection, purpose & disposal)
