## The Information Commissioner calls: What to expect

In this IIL lecture Mark explained how the Information Commissioner approaches the investigation and resolution of data breaches. The Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) is undertaking proactive, as well as reactive, investigations into the privacy practices of a wide range of organisations. The ICO has issued heavy penalties against organisations breaching these civil rules and branded them as 'crooks' and 'criminals'.

Proposed changes to the law mean that individual directors, as well as their organisations, could each face penalties of £500,000.

This talk provided practical, legal and tactical advice on managing ICO investigations into breaches of the current law. It also highlighted changes under the forthcoming General Data Protection Regulation.

- The practical, legal and tactical issues to consider
- The changes brought in by the GDPR
