

Travel & Car Parking

Free car parking is available on-site and there are over 2,000 spaces. No permits or vehicle registration details are required.

If you are travelling by train, Lingfield station is on the line between London Victoria or London Bridge and East Grinstead. The venue is part of Lingfield Park Marriott Hotel and Country Club and the walking distance is 0.8 miles via Station Road and Racecourse Road. Alternatively there is a much shorter route. Just walk off the end of the station platform (side with trains going towards London) and follow the path through the park, then cross over the main road to reach the venue's back gate. The gate will be open for us and will be marked.

There are no taxis outside the station so should you prefer to travel by taxi, the local firm is Lingfield Taxis on 01342 835835.
